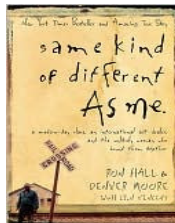

Coming Books of the Month:

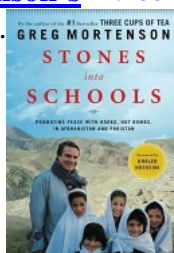
April Showers bring May Flowers and many readers who haven't yet discovered...*Same Kind of Different as Me* by
